The Neighborhood Free Health Clinic Offers Care for People with Chronic Illnesses

STOUGHTON, Wis., August 27, 2020 – The Neighborhood Free Health Clinic today announced it will be offering diabetic foot care clinics and blood pressure checks during the month of September to care for those with chronic illnesses.

The Neighborhood Free Health Clinic’s services are normally only available to adults without health insurance. However, these specialty clinics are open to the public and are provided with the support of Edgewood College nursing students who are completing clinical rotations. The diabetic foot care clinics and blood pressure checks are an opportunity to care for the health of our community while providing students hands-on experience in the nursing field.

“Being diagnosed with a chronic illness is life changing,” said Mike Donahue, volunteer RN with the Neighborhood Free Health Clinic. “We’re happy for the chance to help our neighbors who are living with diagnoses like diabetes, and grateful for student nurses who dedicate so much time and care to our patients.”

Everyone in the local communities living with diabetes or in need of a blood pressure check is invited to participate in the upcoming clinics hosted at the Neighborhood Free Health Clinic, 1520 Vernon Street, Stoughton, WI, 53589. The clinics will take place on September 1 and September 17 from 4:30 to 7:30 pm.
